Driving East or West on I-64:

exit at 5A, I-65 South, and follow directions below.

Driving South on I-65:

exit at I36C, Jefferson Street (veer right at the fork). From Jefferson Street, turn left on First Street. Turn left on Chestnut Street. Turn left on Brook Street. Turn right immediately after Abraham Flexner Way behind the Rudd Heart and Lung Center. Follow the signs to the Patient Parking Garage.

Driving North on I-65:
